### School focus

**Definition:** Core aspects of the school's program (2006-07).

**Sources:** Selected by A+ schools from information provided by individual charter schools and charter school Web sites.

### Special education

**Definition:** Information about special education services was provided by each charter school. Please note: by law, charter schools must serve students according to their Individual Education Plans (IEPs). Like school districts, charter schools must not discriminate against students based on disability.

**Sources:** Individual charter schools.

### Graduation rate (Northside Urban Pathways only)

**Definition:** The 2006 graduation rate was determined by adding the number of dropouts in 9th grade in 2002-03, in 10th grade in 2003-04, in 11th grade in 2004-05, and in 12th grade in 2005-06 to the number of 2006 graduates, then dividing the number of 2006 graduates by that total.

## Tests given by the school

### City Charter High School:

**Definition:** New Standards Reference Examinations for Reading and Mathematics: percentage of 10th grade students achieving each standard. ACT assessments in English, Reading, Mathematics and Science: standard scores for a cohort of students who took the ACT series—the EXPLORE assessment in 9th grade, the PLAN assessment in 10th grade, and the ACT college readiness assessment in 11th grade. Scores for all subject areas were combined into one composite standard score. The cohort represents 56 students who took all three assessments between 2002 and 2005. The combined scores should remain the same year to year if school growth occurred at the same rate as the national norm group.

### Northside Urban Pathways Charter School:

**Definition:** Percent of students at the Proficient or Advanced achievement levels on the Stanford Achievement Tests (SAT 10) for Reading, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies, in 7th, 9th and 10th grades.

### Urban League of Pittsburgh:

**Definition:** Mean Normal Curve Equivalent (MNCE) for the TerraNova Reading, Language Arts, and Mathematics assessments, in 1st, 2nd, and 4th grades. MNCE is calculated by adding the normal curve equivalent scores of all students in the group and dividing by the total number of students in that group. Test scores were reported on a scale from 1-99, with 50 being an average score.

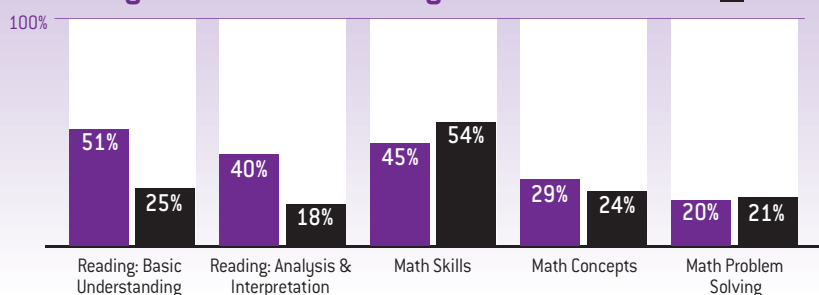

### New Standards Reference Examinations (10th grade): Percentage of students achieving each standard

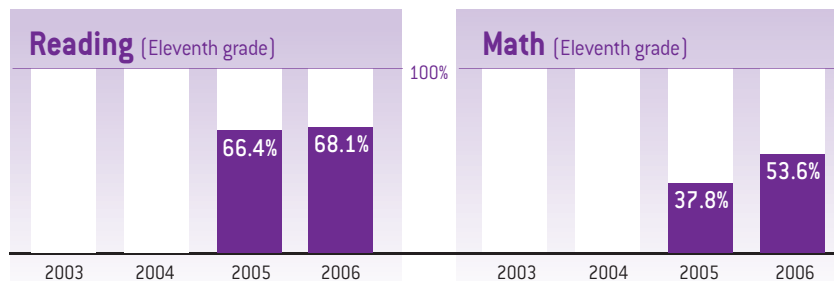


### ACT assessments: English, Reading, Mathematics, Science (measuring growth over time for a group of students)\*
