

Pittsburgh's K-8 schools

In the 2005-06 school year:

The average K-8 school had 352 students and 20 teachers.

93.8% of K-8 and elementary students attended school on the average day.

72.5% of K-8 and elementary students were eligible for free or reduced price lunch (a measure of family poverty).
