



Pittsburgh's high schools

In the 2016-17 school year:

Pittsburgh had 4 high (9-12) schools. The average high school had **999** students and **76** teachers. **57%** of high school students were economically disadvantaged (receiving public assistance). **40%** of high school students attended their school of assignment ("capture rate"). The average site-based cost per high school student was **\$8,856**.

Teaching

79% of high school teachers feel their school is a good place to work and learn.*

22% of high school teachers performed at the Proficient level.

77% of high school teachers performed at the Distinguished level.

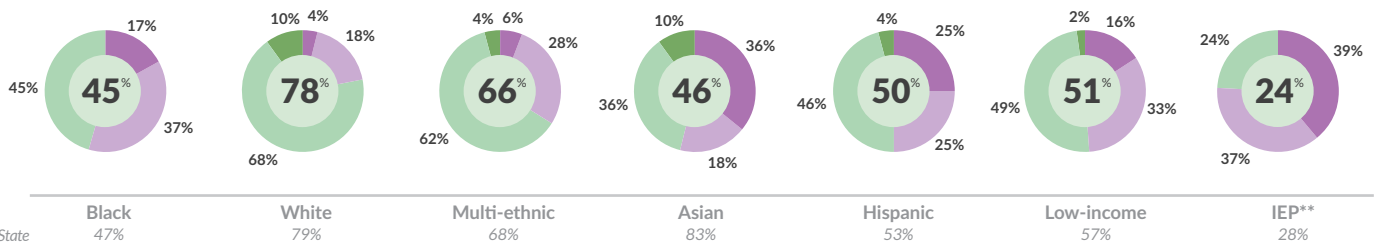

Percentage of high school students at each Keystone achievement level by the end of 11th grade, 2017

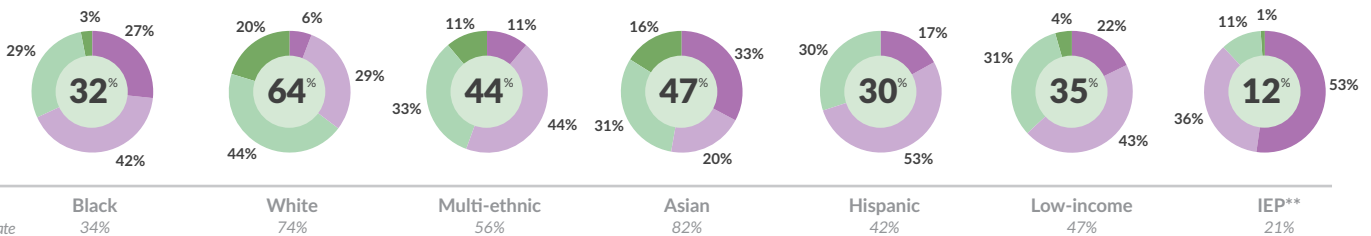

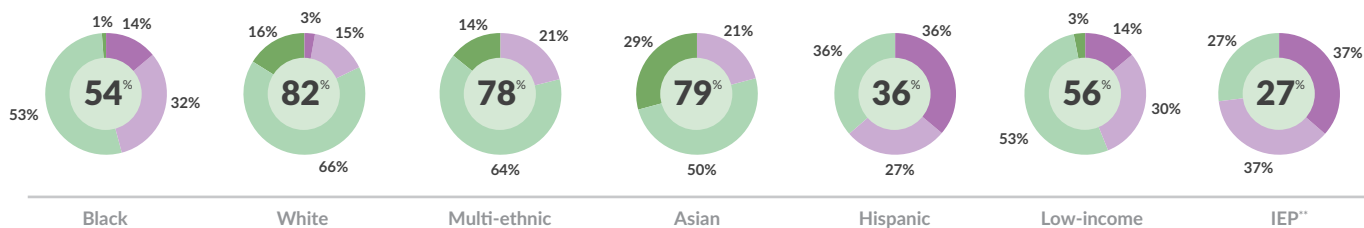

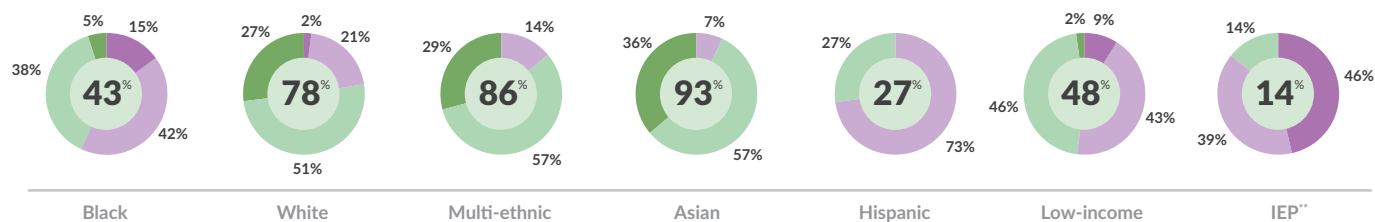
Percentage of students at each Keystone achievement level by the end of 11th grade, 2017

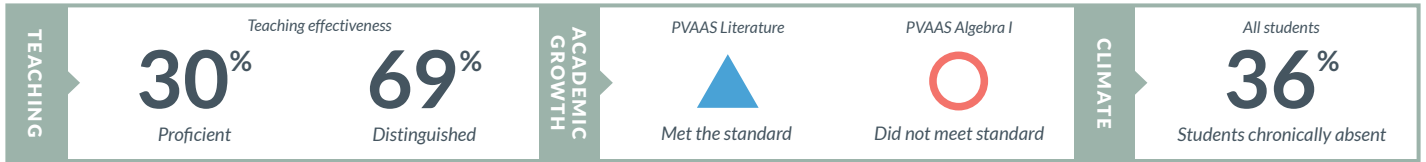

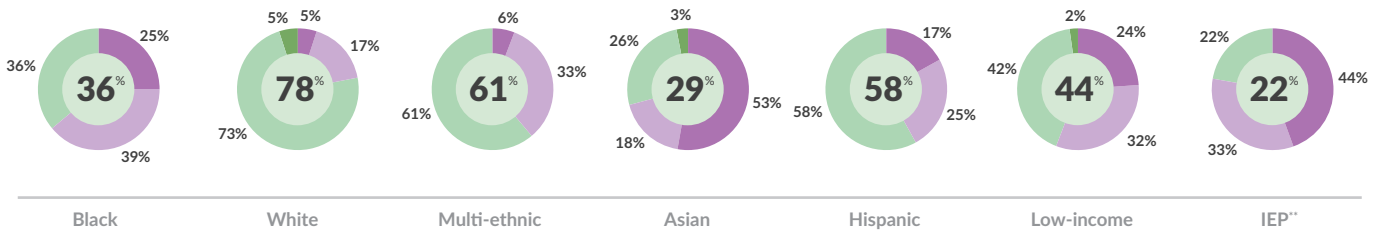

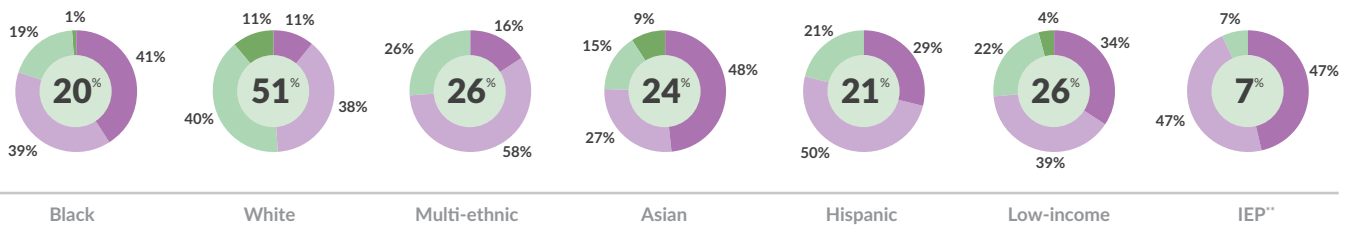
Percentage of students at each Keystone achievement level by the end of 11th grade, 2017

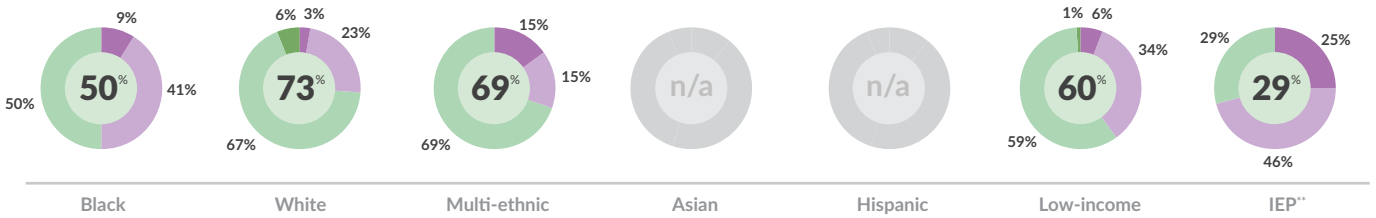

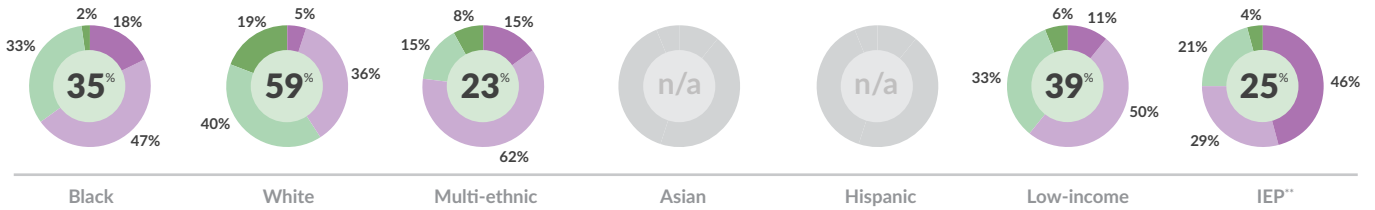

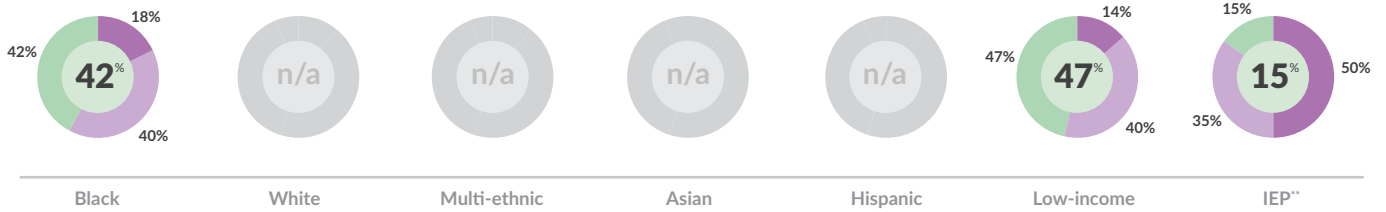
