The average high school had 716 students and 58 teachers.

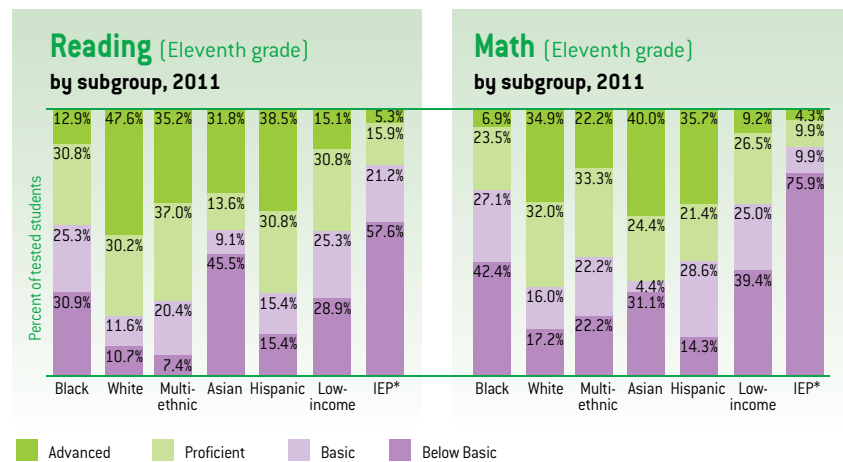

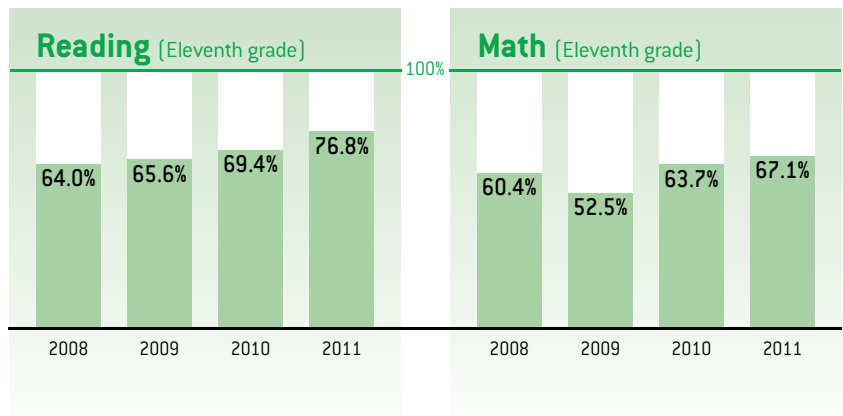

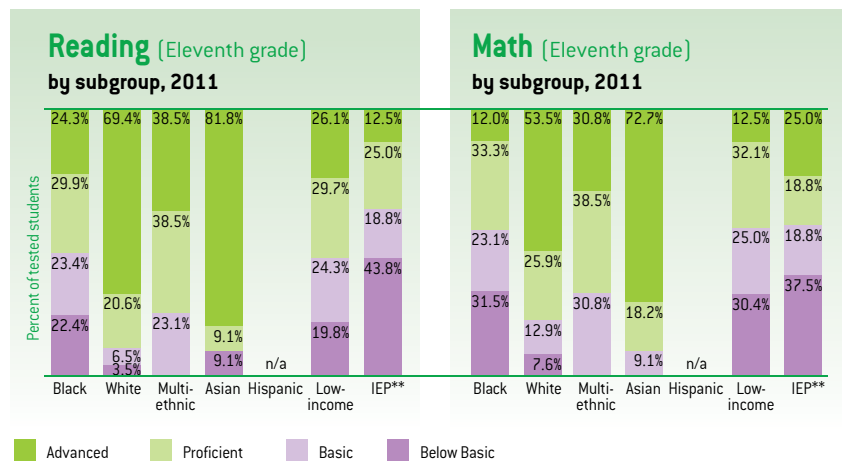

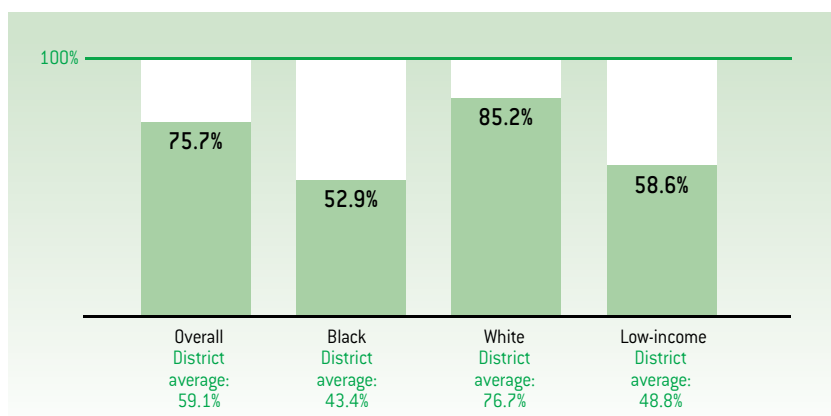

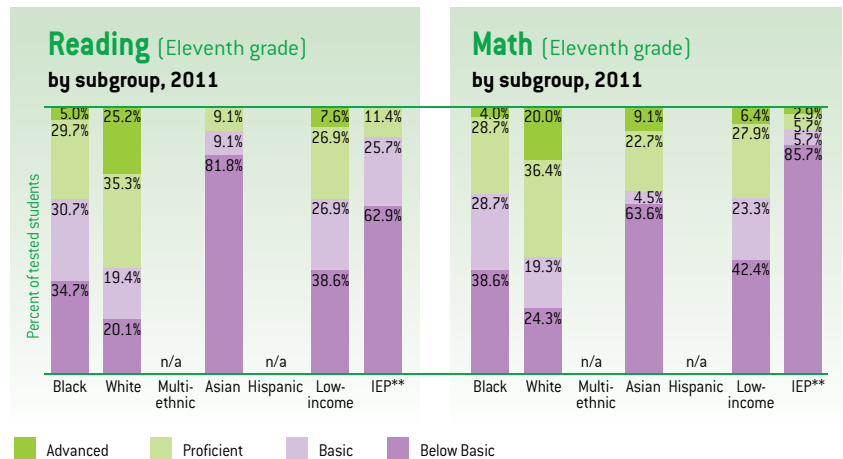

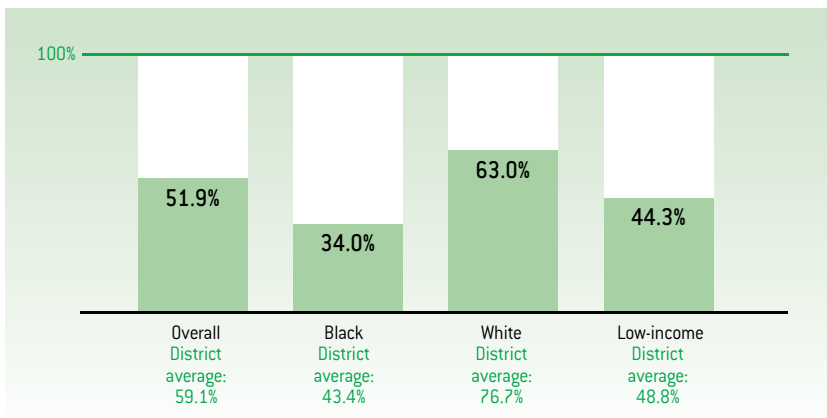

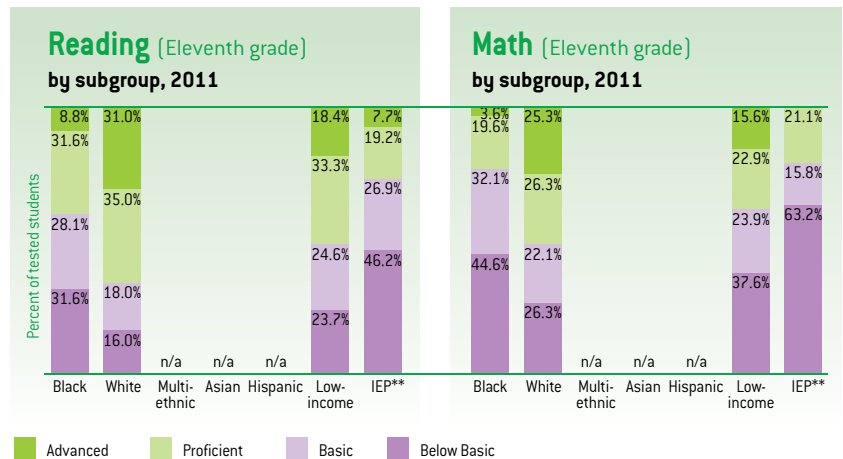

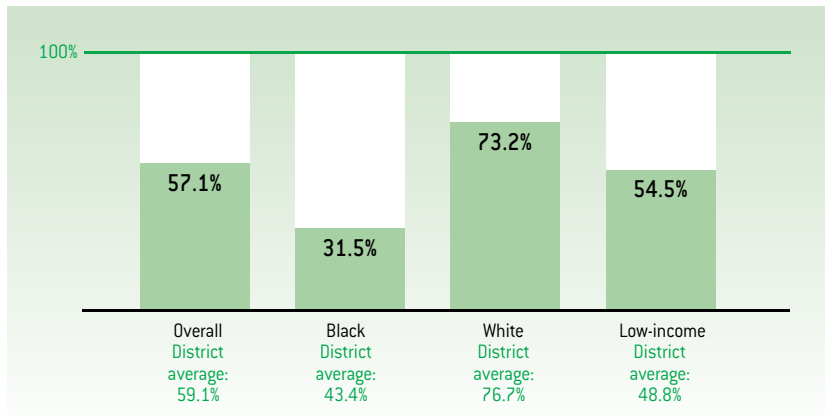

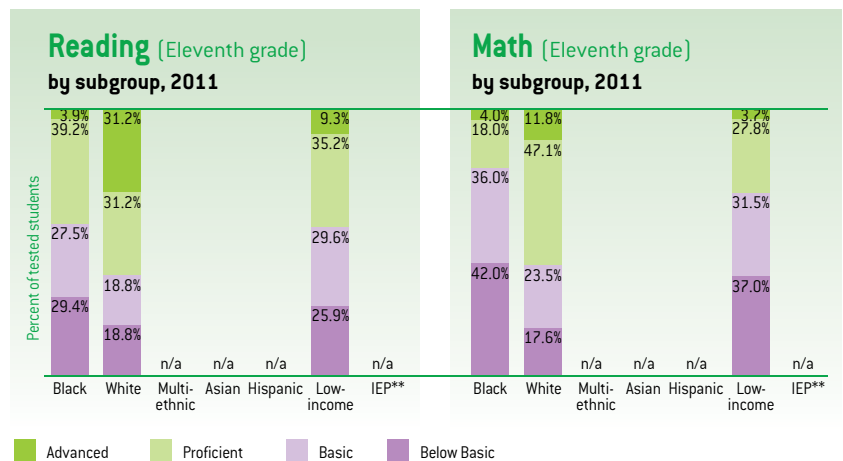

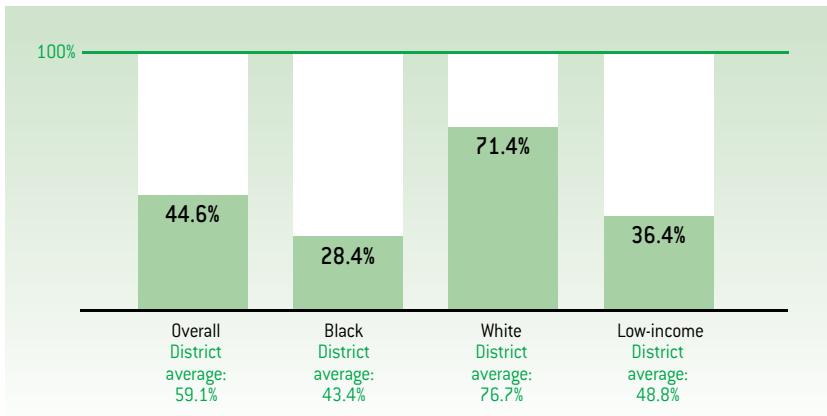

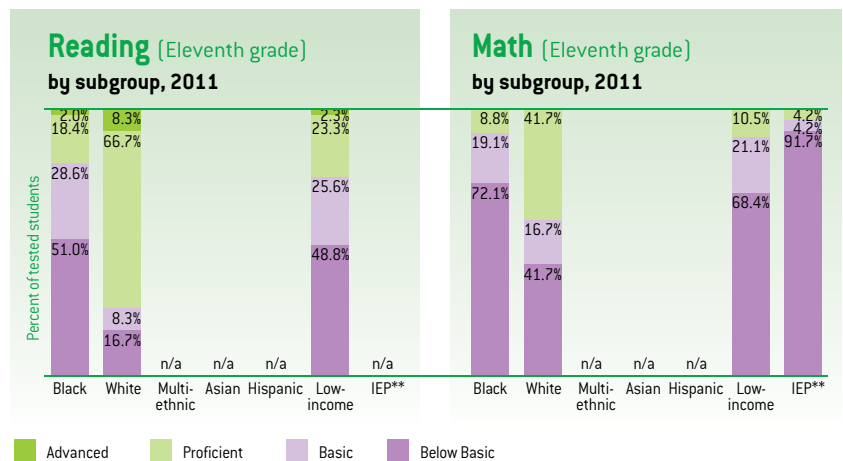

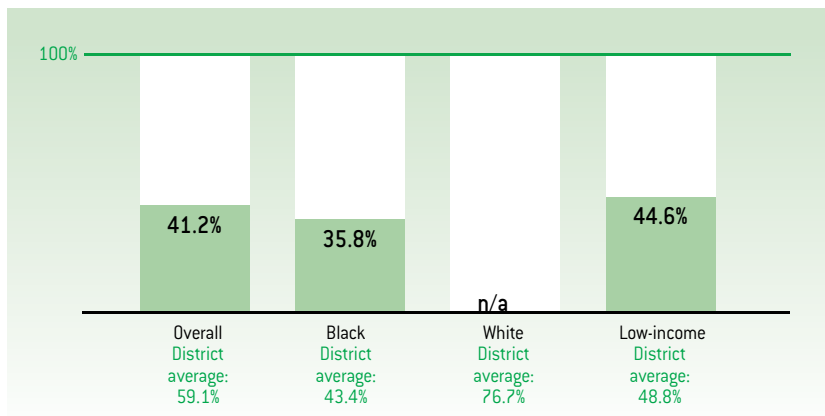

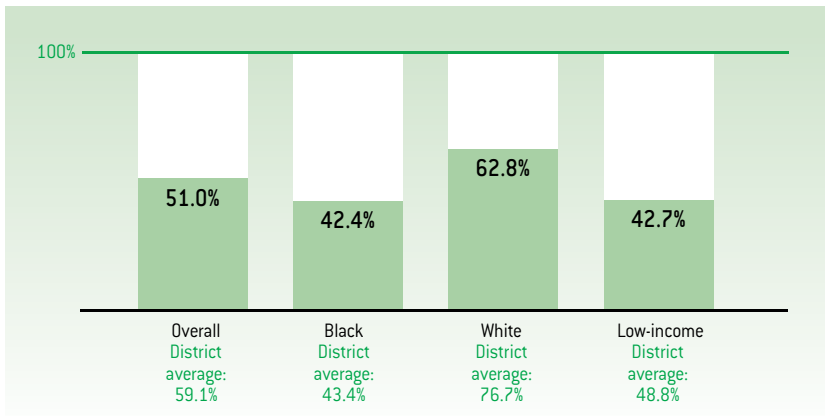

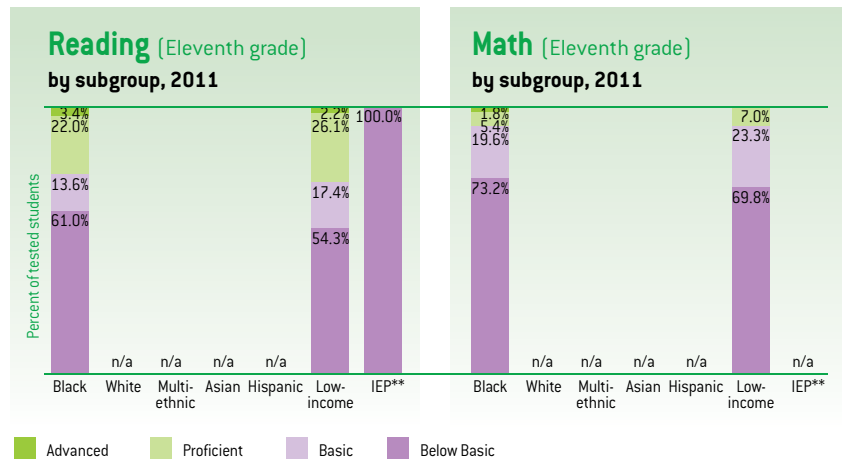

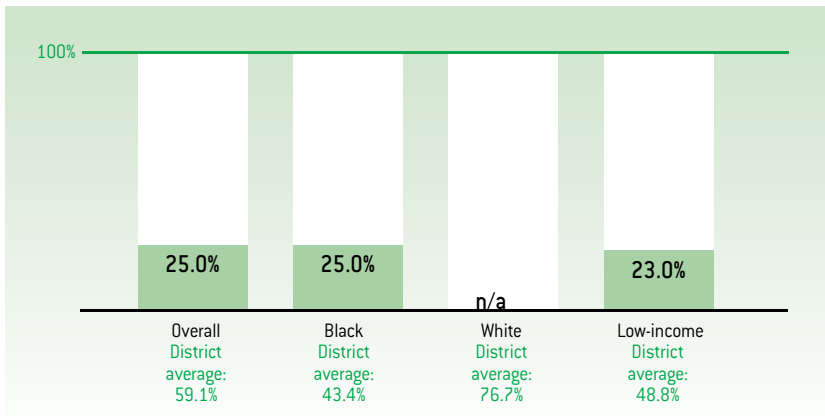
